THE FRIENDS' ART AND WINE TOUR IN MORAVIA 22nd - 28th September 2014 3

The Czech Republic boasts a remarkably rich artistic and architectural heritage, with fine examples from every period of history. This tour will focus on Moravia; in addition to the many fine buildings, the region also possesses a wine industry that has made great strides in recent years. We shall be visiting a wide selection of the great houses, palaces and churches, guided by expert, leading conservators, and gaining access to parts of some buildings that are not generally open. The tour will take us to wine-growing locations and wineries, giving participants a chance to see not only many sites of interest, but also the beautiful countryside of the region, with a chance to taste a wide selection of its very appealing wines.

ROVISIONAL PROGRAMME OF

Monday 22 September Meet at Vienna airport at 11.30am. Transfer by coach to Mikulov, a pretty town near the Austrian border with a notable castle and churches, which is also an important wine-making centre. We shall spend three nights in the Hotel Templ, located in the centre of the old town. During the afternoon we shall visit the castle and the tomb of the Dietrichstein Family, followed by a local trip to the ancient wine cellars in the village of **Petrov-Plže**. We shall have dinner in the **Sonberk Winery**, designed by the leading contemporary architect Josef Pleskot.

Tuesday 23 September We shall visit Znojmo, which still possesses its city walls and numerous beautiful houses and churches, and we shall also visit the painted cellar in Šatov. We shall continue to the chateau of Uherčice, where the visit will include a brief musical performance in the painted ballroom, whose restoration is supported by the Friends and which boasts a fine acoustic. This will be followed by a wine-tasting at Velké Němčice, and lunch in the parsonage of the village of Stálky. In the afternoon we shall visit the chateau of Vranov, part of which was designed by the great Austrian architect J B Fischer von Erlach. Upon return to Mikulov we shall visit the cellar of Volařík Mikulov for a wine-tasting.



Wednesday 24 September We shall visit the chateau of Jaroměřice, which also possesses its own theatre. We shall then continue to the city of Brno, where we shall visit one or two of the city's fine buildings, and then we shall have lunch at the Pavilon restaurant in the Zeman Kavárna, a notable example of Functionalist architecture. We shall then visit the Tugendhat Villa, a celebrated example of Modernist architecture designed by Mies van der Rohe. This will be followed by a brief concert in the Mitrovský Pavilion. Returning from Brno in the early evening, we shall have the opportunity for a drive around the Pálava Hills, an area of outstanding natural beauty surrounding Mikulov, and this will be followed by dinner at Café Fara in Klentice.

Thursday 25 September We shall visit the Liechtenstein estate of Valtice-Lednice, a UNESCO-listed site, including both the Chateaux, the Winter Garden and some of the park follies, to include lunch at the Januv Hrad folly. We shall then continue to Milotice, a notable Baroque chateau. From Milotice we shall move to the Chytil Winery at Dubňany for a tasting. Thence we shall drive to Uherské Hradiště where we shall stay for three nights at the Hotel Slunce.

Friday 26 September We shall visit the town of Olomouc, where the Old Town boasts many historical buildings, and which has been the seat of the Archbishops of Olomouc since 1777. Our visit will include the Archbishop's Palace and both museums. Following these visits we shall lunch at the Vila Primavesi, a Secessionist house in the central part of the town. From Olomouc we shall continue to Kroměřiž, where we shall visit the Archbishop's Summer Palace, a UNESCO-listed site. Here we shall see the interior of the palace, which contains many fine paintings and a magnificent assembly room and library, and then we shall visit the Flower Garden, which has been largely restored to its Baroque format. This will be followed by a wine-tasting in the Archbishop's Sklep, prior to returning to Uherské Hradiště.

Saturday 27 September We shall visit the Fortress of Buchlov, perched on its crag, which dates back to the 13th Century. We then continue to the Italianate Villa Buchlovice, built for the Italian wife of the Lord of Buchlov in the late 17th Century, and designed by Domenico Martinelli. The house also boasts a magnificent garden and park. On return to Uherské Hradiště in the evening there will be a final wine-tasting and dinner at **Mařatice Vineyards** outside Uherské Hradiště.

Sunday 28 September Leave (with luggage) for Vienna airport in time for afternoon flights.

PRACTICALITIES:

This seven-day (six-night) tour will cost £1,390 per person in a twin-bedded or double room. There is a £100 supplementary charge for single occupancy. This will include bed and breakfast in a 3-star and in a 4-star hotel, both of which are in converted historic buildings, all lunches, four dinners, all coach transport, all entrance fees and gratuities, and the services of the trip guide and of local Czech guides. The cost does not include the cost of flights to/from Vienna. The coach will collect the party from Vienna Airport at 11.30am on the day of arrival and will return them there at 3.00pm on the day of departure. Please check that a place is available on the trip before booking your flight.

CANCELLATIONS:

Cancellation charges are as follows:
