



Since 1983, April 18th has been celebrated as International Day for Monuments and Sites by UNESCO. Now, it is better known as World Heritage Day, or *Hari Pusaka Dunia* in Indonesian. The theme for this year is "Shared Cultures, Shared Heritage, Shared Responsibility". The word "shared" can be interpreted as *'bersama'*. In a global context, *'bersama'* can be reflected in presenting legacy of heritage as part of cultural identity, while also synergizing with dynamic changes in every part of the world.

Heritage is constantly adapting to change, especially now that the whole world is facing COVID-19 pandemic. It is interesting to see how conservationists maintain solidarity and heritage conservation in this situation. Even so, change is not always interpreted as a negative thing; it can also be a positive endeavour. One example of such positive change is the increase of public interest in a nation's heritage. This can be seen from how many communities, organizations, and individuals are actively engaging in history and culture. Enthusiasm in terms of conservation is a very good thing in it itself, but of course, it will get more benefit if there are collaborations between actors, conservationists, and stakeholders.

To answer this challenge, Badan Pelestarian Pusaka Indonesia (BPPI/the Indonesian Heritage Trust) celebrates this year's World Heritage Day in the form of 12 hours non stop livestreaming with the themes mentioned above. The programs will be conducted online via Zoom application and broadcasted live through BPPI YouTube channel. It consists of talk show, film, music, poetry reading , and other creative activities. The series of talk show will have seven sessions dealing with subthemes which are *Budaya Bersama* (Shared Cultures), *Pusaka Bersama* (Shared Heritage), and *Tanggungjawab Bersama* (Shared Responsibility).

This World Heritage Day celebration will be conducted online via Zoom application and broadcasted live through BPPI YouTube channel. It will be joined by 36 participants comprised of heritage experts from around the world, as well as academicians, member of heritage trusts, local artists, musicians, and film directors taking part in this 12-hour program. It will be included also representatives from government related institutions. Details of the program from 09.00 am to 09.00 pm is enclosed with this ToR. Through this year's celebration of World Heritage Day, we hope to promote our shared cultures, shared heritage, and shared responsibility in the context of local, regional, and global level, and pass this difficult time together.
